- Help schools purchase 100% New Jersey-grown produce, meats, seafood, and grains to serve in school lunch programs.
- Invest New Jersey tax dollars directly in New Jersey farmers, fishermen, and communities.
- Increase the amount of local, culturally relevant, highquality food reaching students in New Jersey.
- Develop new economic opportunities for New Jersey farmers, producers, and ranchers.
- Support state food security and food systems!

THE FARM TO SCHOOL LOCAL FOOD PROCUREMENT REIMBURSEMENT GRANT PROGRAM WILL PROVIDE:

1. **Grants** to school food authorities to offset the cost of purchasing local food for school meals.



2. Technical assistance to support schools with cooking techniques, equipment, and staffing to fully leverage New Jerseygrown products in meal programs.



3. Resources for the New Jersey
Department of Agriculture to
build connections between
growers and schools, evaluate
program effectiveness, and offer
critical capacity to manage and
oversee the program.

WHY MORE LOCAL FOOD IN SCHOOLS?

Economic Win - Research has shown every \$1 spent on local foods for school meals generates \$1.40 for local economies.¹

 Schools increasing their local procurement increases and diversify farm sales, generating secure and viable market opportunities for New Jersey family farmers.

Public Health Win - Purchasing, promoting, and serving local foods in school meals has led to students eating 37% more vegetables and 11% more fruit.²

Food insecurity is prevalent across New Jersey,³
and Farm to School can increase the diversity and
quality of food in school meals increasing access
to fresh and nutritious foods for students.

Community Win - Connecting farmers back to their communities and students to local agriculture supports local food systems and increases food security.

 Keeping food grown in New Jersey inside the state strengthens our food supply chains, and offers a resilient, climate-smart solution with fewer "food miles" between source and consumer.
